Monroe's B.S. in Public Health/Pre-Nursing Track

A better way to prepare for your nursing studies and gain acceptance into our certificate and degree programs

What does it really take to become a nurse? What college courses are required and what training must you complete?

Our two-semester B.S. in Public Health/Pre-Nursing Track is designed to help give you a better idea and prepare you for more advanced nursing studies.

Students will take a variety of science, math and liberal arts courses that will introduce them to basic nursing curriculum (see back for complete course listing) and enhance their chances of being accepted into Monroe's Practical Nurse Certificate or Registered Nurse Associate degree programs.



A GREAT PLACE TO START

Participating freshmen will be registered as full-time students in our B.S in Public Health Degree Program/Pre-Nursing Track. The course sequence will begin with the Fall semester and classes will meet Monday through Thursday in the daytime only. Health and science courses will be held two days a week on Monroe's Bronx campus, while liberal arts courses will be taught the remaining two days in New Rochelle.

To answer any questions and guide you along the way, every student in the Pre-Nursing Track will be assigned a personal advisor.

APPLYING CREDITS IN THE FUTURE

If you are ultimately accepted into one of Monroe's advanced nursing programs, a maximum of nine credits earned in our Pre-Nursing Track will be applied to the PN certificate program and an additional three credits will be applied to the RN degree program. The other credits will be "banked" towards your Bachelor's degree.

Remember, however, if you are not accepted into either program, or if for some reason you choose not to pursue a future in nursing, **all the credits you earn in the Pre-Nursing Track are applicable to our Public Health degree or any other allied health degree we offer.** This gives you more flexibility in the future.

- Have a strong GPA
- Have completed a curriculum that includes high school science classes
- Place into college-level Math and English on Monroe's placement exams
- Interview with our Admissions Committee
