BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING Progressive Option — PN to RN to BS

The Monroe College B.S. in Nursing Progressive Option offers students the opportunity to smoothly transition through three levels of nursing studies in nine semesters over three academic years:

YEAR ONE	YEAR TWO	YEAR THREE
Certificate in Practical Nursing	Associate Degree in Nursing	Bachelor of Science Degree, Nursing Major

Candidates who are already Licensed Practical Nurses may enter the program directly at the Associate level.

Who Should Apply?

The program seeks to admit adults who are seeking a career in nursing. This is a full-time day program. Candidates must be prepared to attend college three full semesters each academic year for three years.

Admission Requirements

The School of Nursing Admissions Committee holistically reviews each applicant's admission materials and selects the most highly qualified candidates for a limited number of seats. Applicants must provide the following:

- ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) scores at the Proficient Level or higher
- High school transcripts with an overall grade point average of 75 or higher
- Evidence of satisfactory grades (generally, C+ or higher) in algebra, biology/living environment and chemistry at the high school or college level
- College transcripts with a grade point average of 2.75 or higher, for candidates who have previously earned college credits
- Two letters of recommendation from employers, academic institutions, or community organizations

Application Process

A nursing admissions advisor will lead each applicant through the required steps:

- **1.** Submit the Monroe College online application, including the personal statement and \$35 application fee
- 2. Submit the required documents

Once the application and admissions documentation has been evaluated, eligible candidates are scheduled for an interview with the School of Nursing Admissions Committee. Candidates are provided timely notice of the Committee's decision. Those who are accepted will complete the financial aid process and are subject to a background check and a physical exam.

Application Deadlines

- Fall Semester Enrollment: June 15th
- Winter Semester Enrollment: October 15th
