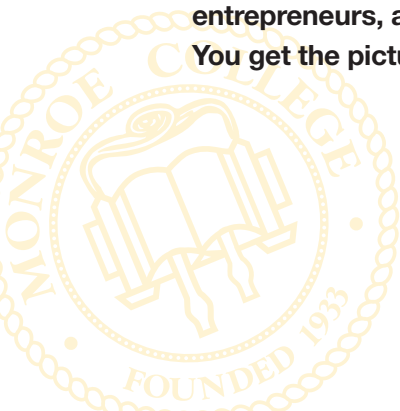


THE MONROE ADVANTAGE PLAN (MAP)

One of Monroe's greatest advantages is its three-semester academic calendar that makes it possible to earn a Bachelor's degree in as little as three years. You can earn 45 credits every year instead of the traditional 30. Think about that for a minute. You can earn your Bachelor's degree in the same time it takes most people to earn their Associate degree elsewhere – and still have a total of eight weeks of vacation time between semesters.

EARN 45 CREDITS OR MORE IN ONE YEAR

Monroe students can earn 45 credits in one year by attending all three semesters: Fall (September), Winter (January) and Spring (April). We also have an August Bridge semester just for freshmen; they take two classes, earning six credits before September. That means you can earn **51 CREDITS** in your first year!

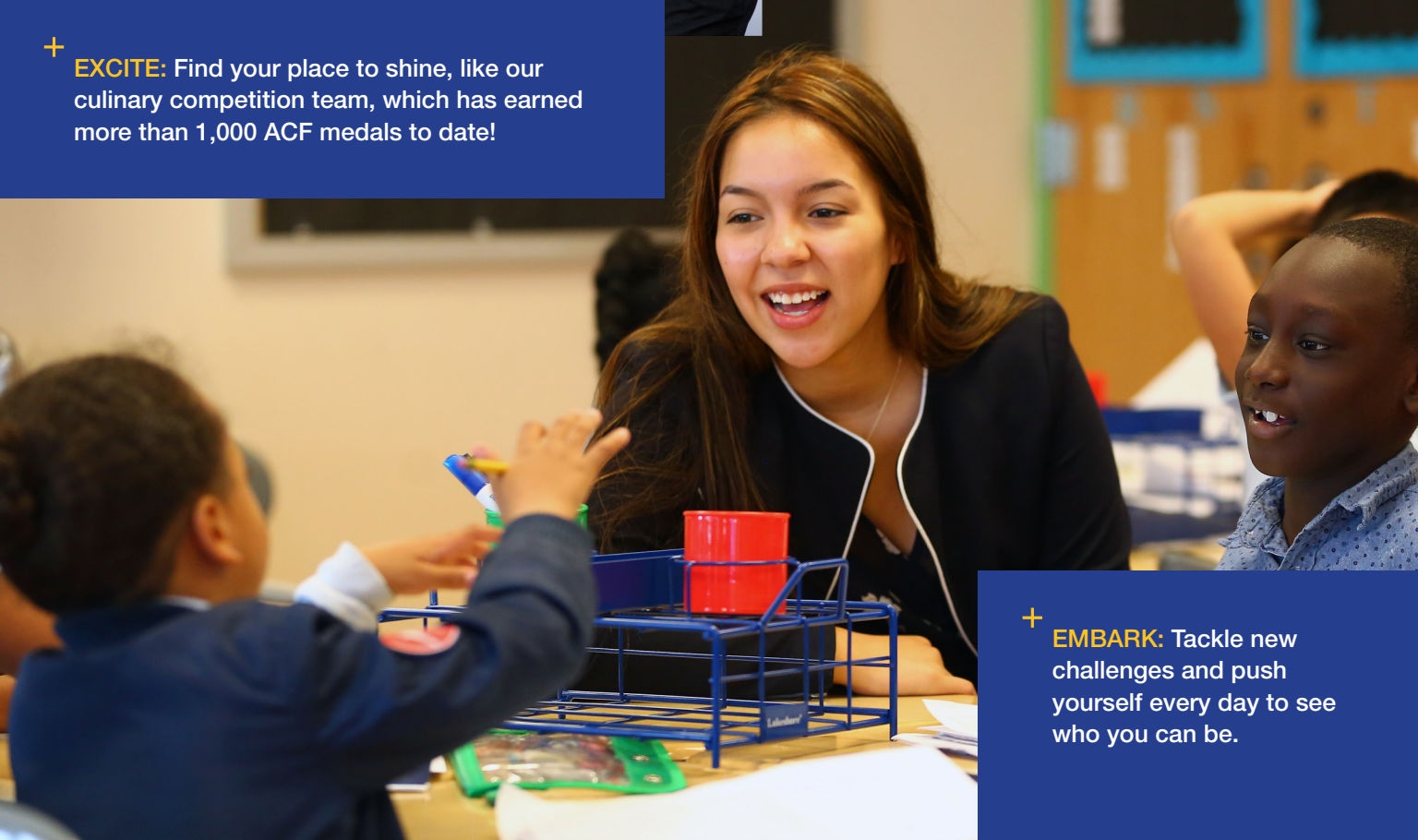

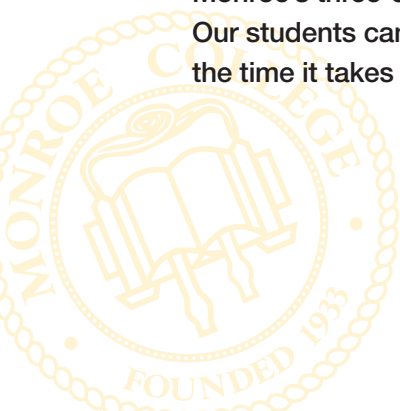
