This 30-credit master's program in Bilingual Education for New York State licensed teachers, provides coursework and fieldwork taught in both English and Spanish for candidates who are bilingual. Through a fully online format over 3 semesters of full-time or part-time study, students will gain an understanding of the challenges Emerging Bilingual Learners (EBLs) face, and develop pedagogical skills and instructional strategies to support EBL literacy and content development in English and Spanish. Furthermore, students will have opportunities to apply their course work-study in the field, which can be completed in each candidates' own school.

A Capstone Thesis (ED 725) is required for graduation, which incorporates a TPA project during classes with fieldwork (ED 608, 628, 632, 635, and 655). Students will demonstrate bilingual competence by passing the NYSED CST in Bilingual Education and earn New York State certification as a bilingual educator in the grade bands of their current New York State License.

The Master of Science in Education Degree for Teaching Emerging Bilingual Learners (K-12) is a 30-credit program consisting of ten (10) 3-credit courses. The suggested path for full-time study follows.
