(BS)

The Public Health degree program provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the systems and institutions of American public health care. It also helps students understand the systems that protect and improve the health of people and communities through education, injury and disease prevention, and promotion of healthy lifestyles. Students will be provided with the knowledge and skills to collect and analyze data, identify community needs as well as plan, implement, monitor and evaluate programs designed to encourage healthy lifestyles, policies, and environments. Monroe professors use project-based learning in the classroom to allow students to actively participate in the learning process and apply their critical thinking skills. Students in the Bachelor's in Public Health program have the opportunity to choose a minor in Human Services.



DID YOU KNOW?

- Monroe's Allied Health program provides its students the opportunity to travel during their Spring Break each year to provide medical assistance and education to underserved communities.
- The Allied Health Club designs, implements and evaluates health education and promotion programs in response to the needs of the Monroe College student population and the local community.
- Monroe's School of Allied Health provides hands-on learning with fully functional simulated pharmacy as well as separate laboratories for anatomy and physiology, chemistry, microbiology, medical assisting, and sonography.
- Allied Health students have the opportunity to join the Alpha Eta National Honor Society, which promotes and recognizes significant scholarship, leadership, and contributions to the allied health professions. Society students select, organize and carry out community service projects each semester.
