Monroe's Bachelor's degree in Human Services, which builds upon the Associate degree, develops practitioners who are educated, ethical thinkers capable of applying their knowledge to serving others in various aspects of society, as leaders and managers. Students in the program are provided with the knowledge and skills necessary to seek employment in management and leadership roles, working with adults and children in a variety of settings. Students in this program receive real-world experience by completing two supervised field experiences, which increases their marketability upon graduation.

- Monroe's Human Services program provides its students the opportunity to explore other cultures and communities as an added value to their course of study.
- Monroe's Human Services Club helps to strengthen ties between the college community and Human Services organizations in the city, creating pathways for meaningful projects and career opportunities for students.
- According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, about 23% more Human Service professionals will be needed in 2017 than were needed in 2016.
