Clinically rich fieldwork, made possible through partner public, private and charter schools in the metropolitan area, is paired with classroom learning.



DID YOU KNOW?

- In June 2014, the school announced the expansion of the Bachelor of Science degree program in Early Childhood Education to meet the increased demand for educators created by the introduction of New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio's universal pre-kindergarten program.
- Monroe College School of Education has partnered with the Board of Education Early Childhood Division to provide exciting pre-k employment opportunities for our students.
- Monroe's School of Education maintains a partnership with the AmeriCorps Jumpstart Program, an early childhood education organization that trains college students to serve preschool children in low-income neighborhoods, providing students with the opportunity to complete over 300 hours of teaching experience in pre-kindergarten classes, in exchange for tuition support or a direct salary. Monroe is one of 17 schools in the tri-state area to partner with Jumpstart.
- Monroe has established partnerships with more than a dozen public, private and charter schools offering our students the most extensive clinical preparation with over 600 classroom hours!
