The Monroe College B.S. in Nursing RN to BS Option offers Registered Nurses who graduated from an associate degree or diploma-granting nursing program an opportunity to earn the B.S. in Nursing in eleven months. This program is offered primarily in online and hybrid formats and requires students to attend classes onsite one full day each week.

Admission Requirements

- A copy of the applicant's RN license
- Associate degree or diploma program transcripts, indicating an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Two letters of recommendation from employers, academic institutions, or community organizations
- Proof of a recent background check

Application Process

A nursing admissions advisor will lead each applicant through the required steps:

1. Submit the Monroe College online application, including the personal statement and \$35 application fee
2. Submit the required documents listed above
3. Complete the financial aid process
4. Complete a physical exam

Application Deadlines

- Fall Semester Enrollment August 1st
- Winter Semester Enrollment December 1st
- Spring Semester Enrollment April 1st
