# BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

## Traditional Option

The Monroe College B.S. in Nursing Traditional Option prepares graduates for a career as Registered Nurses. Graduates will earn a B.S. with a nursing major and be eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN licensing exam. The Traditional Option admits students once per year in the Fall semester. The length of the program is eight semesters over three academic years.

### Who Should Apply?

The program seeks to admit current high school seniors and recent high school graduates who experienced a rigorous college preparatory curriculum.

### Admission Requirements

The School of Nursing Admissions Committee holistically reviews each applicant's admission materials and selects the most highly qualified candidates for a limited number of seats. Applicants must provide the following:

- ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) scores at the Proficient Level or higher
- High school transcripts with an overall grade point average of 80 or higher
- Evidence of satisfactory grades (generally, C+ or higher) in algebra, biology/living environment and chemistry at the high school or college level

Two letters of recommendation from high school faculty/staff or community organizations

**NOTE:** Students who have taken the SAT or ACT exams should submit scores to strengthen their application.

### Application Process

A nursing admissions advisor will lead each applicant through the required steps:

1. Submit the Monroe College online application, including the personal statement and \$35 application fee
2. Submit the required documents

Once the application and admissions documentation has been evaluated, eligible candidates are scheduled for an interview with the School of Nursing Admissions Committee. Candidates are provided timely notice of the Committee's decision. Those who are accepted will complete the financial aid process and are subject to a background check and a physical exam.

### Application Deadlines

- November 15th for a December early decision
- March 15th for an April decision
